1. Culture is Key

- Culture is a permission system. It's "how we do things here"
- Never neutral
- Generosity cannot be in a silo. It must be a thread that runs through the entire church
- Gateway Church and Sun Valley Community Church

Culture Of Generosity

"Churches that are becoming known for their generosity are moving away from a campaign mentality that focuses on giving primarily in response to needs... Instead, they are creating a pervasive culture of generosity that captures hearts, reinforces values, and connects a wide range of resources with needs in specific, tangible ways."

2. Follow Me

Generous churches are led by generous pastors

People know when pastor has money issues

Talk about your journey

It is the job of the leader to gather resources

"I give because you do."

3. Good Strategy is Better Than Good Intentions Hope is not a strategy

Can't just assume it will happen

Information and transformation

Comprehensive

4. Embrace the Ministry of Asking

- What you want for your people, not what you want from them
- First step is listening identify the giver's passion
- "Ask" = information, inspiration, and invitation

5. Leverage Your Platform

- 52 chances per year
- "Home field advantage"
- · Build trust consistent and persistent
- Cast (and re-cast) vision
- Demonstrate impact
- Enhance relationships

Talking About Money

"Part of leadership is telling people what they don't want to hear. So many of you are afraid to talk about money... you are going to have to get over your insecurity about this issue (of preaching on giving)" - Rick Warren, Saddleback Church

Reward what you want to encourage

6. Accelerate What You Celebrate

- Catch your people doing something good
- Celebration changes expectations
- Say "thank you"
- Celebrate the gift, no matter where it goes
- Rock Church

7. Measure Progress

- Changes in giving = opportunities for ministry
- Leaders (including Pastors) need accurate, specific giving data
- Don't benchmark against national averages bench mark against yourself
- Fellowship Bible Church Nashville

8. Generosity is Contagious

- Generosity can be taught more often it is caught
- Model good stewardship of church funds
- Abundance vs. scarcity frugal not striggy
- · Giving outside the four walls
- CrossTimbers Church identified ministries outside the church and gave their entire Easter offering to those ministries

9. Disciple High Capacity Givers

- The most overlooked segment of your church
- Wealthy believers have a problem
- Discipleship vs. fund raising
- Opportunities, not needs
- Report results, even failures
- North Coast Church

10. Generosity is the New Evangelism

- Generosity is magnetic
- Provides common ground and a common experience
- Generosity is where the Great Commission and Great Commandment meet
